

# The clergy - our closest allies

All around the world, Mothers' Union supports and works in partnership with the local church; listening to and engaging with parents and families, identifying needs and offering support. Working together, each contributing our unique gifts, skills and time, we can serve both the Church family and the local community. United in faith, we work for the good of our neighbour, as we demonstrate the values and priorities of God's kingdom.

Use the following Talking Points to encourage the group to explore ways to develop the ministry Mothers' Union can offer to families and communities, as part of the mission of the Church. You could read out the following questions one by one, or alternatively cut them up and use them as random cards which different members of the group could draw from, to open up discussion. These questions are provided as cards, ready to cut up, below. If using as cards, hold back the final question about next steps until you are ready to close the activity.



## Talking points

- If you were the parish priest, what sort of relationship would you like with local members of Mothers' Union, and how would you go about establishing and developing this relationship?
- You are a diocesan Bishop how would you encourage a) Mothers' Union and b) the clergy, to explore working even more closely together?
- As Mothers' Union members, what are the best ways to find out how we can best support our local clergy?
- Imagine you are having a first meeting with a new incumbent how would you approach that meeting?
- Share with each other things you or people you know have done to welcome and support clergy. Would any of these or other acts of kindness be appropriate to offer to your current incumbent?
- Is there anything that Mothers' Union does at a national, diocesan or branch level that might discourage clergy from engaging with us? What might these things be and what can we do to change them?
- Sometimes, it's not easy for clergy to understand the range of activities Mothers' Union offers to support families how would you explain the potential we have to offer to a member of the clergy?
- Our next steps: from our discussions today, are there things we might like to do to encourage and support our local clergy?

# Supporting parish ministry

## Suggestions about how to engage with and support the clergy

- Pray for the clergy, for their encouragement and support.
- Try and arrange a face to face meeting, rather than relying on email/post, to help build an ongoing relationship.
- Ahead of any meeting, try to find out first what the priorities of the local clergy are, so
  that you can give some initial thought to how Mothers' Union might be able to support
  and work with the local church.
- At any meeting, encourage the clergy to share with you their priorities, vision, concerns for the church and wider community.
- Be ready to share your story of why Mothers' Union is important to you; why you are
  passionate about supporting families, offering any initial ideas about what Mothers' Union
  might be able to contribute.
- Consider which appropriate Mothers' Union events it might be most helpful (for the clergy!) to invite them to.

## How can Mothers' Union be most helpful?

Sometimes, members of the clergy find it really helpful if we articulate the range of ways Mothers' Union may be able to help support families in and through the Church and in the wider community. The following are suggestions of just some of the support Mothers' Union could offer:
